#### 1a. Faculty exchange program started with the Mariano Marcos State University

On November 19, a special lecture titled "Conditions of the Knee" was provided for the second year Rehabilitation students from the Mariano Marcos State University, Philippines. This was the first attempt for the faculty exchange program with the Mariano Marcos State University after an exchange agreement was concluded between the universities in May 2021. Mr. Francis Chua from the Department of Physical Therapy was invited as a speaker.

### **Research and Other Activities**

#### 3a. Professor Shinya Iida and his students made a presentation on Mathematics teaching method at a national Conference

Professor Shinya Iida from the Faculty of Social Work, and his second-year students learning teaching methodology participated in the 47<sup>th</sup> Annual Conference of Japan Curriculum Research and Development on September 25. They presented a case study of a mathematics class and its post-class review using the "Blackboard writing analysis".

The "Blackboard writing analysis" is a review method developed by Professor Iida based on the post-game analysis of Shogi, a Japanese boardgame also known as Japanese chess. In the presentation, Professor Iida and his students demonstrated a mathematics class teaching and showed the effect of the "Blackboard writing analysis" in the postclass review on a 6<sup>th</sup> grade class in elementary school. The audience showed a great interest in their innovative teaching style that triggers student engagement, as well as the effectiveness of the newly-developed "Blackboard writing analysis" method as a class review.
